Location: Within the Commission's 100-foot shoreline band jurisdiction, at the eastern shoreline of Treasure Island, at Avenue N, between Third Street and Tenth Street, in the City and County of San Francisco.

Description: Over an 11-month period (January to November 2017), no more than 22 days (total) during the final weekend of each month: set-up, operate, and dismantle a flea market; close Avenue N (street only) to the general public between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. except to those paying a \$3.00 market entry fee and residents of Treasure Island visiting the market; and install signs at the flea market entrance(s) to inform the public of open shoreline access area, including the approximately five-foot-wide sidewalk located north of and contiguous with Avenue N, which would remain open and free to the public on market days and all other days of the month.
