Location: In the Bay, a managed wetland, and within the Commission's Primary Management Area of the Suisun Marsh, at Grizzly Island Wildlife Area, in unincorporated Solano County.

Description: Install a lift pump station, consisting of: (1) an approximately 100-foot-long, 30-inch-diameter drain pump and flap gate; (2) an approximately 144-square-foot platform; (3) an approximately 144-square-foot suspended walkway; and (4) an 8-foot-tall by 16-foot-long security fence.

The proposed project would result in approximately 238 square feet of pile-supported fill and six square feet of solid fill (two cubic yards) in a managed wetland, and approximately 20 square feet and 1.3 cubic yards of solid fill in the Bay when the discharge pipe is submerged at high tide.

The project would not result in new public access, nor does it have the potential to adversely affect existing public access. The staff recommends that conditions of approval be incorporated for protection of marsh habitat and water quality, including requiring construction best management practices and other measures to avoid potential construction-related impacts to special status species and water quality.
