SUBJECT: Listing of Pending Administrative Matters
(For Commission consideration on January 16, 2020)

This report lists the administrative permit applications, federal consistency actions, marsh development permits in the Secondary Management Area of the Suisun Marsh, nationwide permit actions, minor amendments to the Suisun Marsh Local Protection Program, and emergency permits that are pending with the Commission. The staff members to whom the matters have been assigned are indicated at the end of the projects' description. Inquiries should be directed to the assigned staff member prior to the Commission meeting.

Administrative Permits and Federal Consistency Actions

The following administrative permit application has been filed and is presently pending with the Commission. The Executive Director will take the action indicated on the matter unless the Commission determines that it is necessary to hold a public hearing.

Location: Within the Commission's 100-foot shoreline band jurisdiction, adjacent to Grove Avenue to the south, in the City of Vallejo, Solano County.

Description:

1. Excavate an approximately 75-square-foot, two-foot-deep trench along the levee crest and remove debris and dispose of approximately five cubic yards of the material outside of the Commission's jurisdiction;
2. Install, use and maintain, an approximately 70-foot-long, nine-inch-wide sheet pile wall at the center of a levee crest with a top-height elevation of approximately one foot above the levee crest;



3. Backfill the trench on either side of the sheet pile wall with approximately five cubic yards of controlled low strength material (CLSM) and cap the embankment with approximately 30 cubic yards compacted soil to bury the top of the sheet pile wall;
4. During construction only, install silt catchment devices (e.g., silt fences, straw wattles);
5. Cover disturbed areas with erosion control mats and hydroseed to restore vegetation; and
6. During construction only, use an approximately 1,000-square-foot area to stage construction equipment.

The project involves the repair of a section of levee within the Commission's 100-foot shoreline band, including the installation of a sheet pile wall. Special conditions would be included to require construction best management practices to avoid impacts to natural resources, including sensitive species and water quality, as a result of construction activities, and to require proper signs for public access closures necessary during construction activities, as well as site restoration post-construction.
