Hey Brock,

Good to hear from you and thanks for calling.

Here's a copy of the 2003 permit that may need to be amended to allow for the installation of a fence to prevent vandalism at private restrooms by homeless. **By copy of this email, I am asking a member of our clerical staff to locate and send you a PDF of the 2008 permit.**

If the fence would be located more than 100 feet from the edge of the Bay and outside any already required public access area, then it would not be in our jurisdiction nor governed by an existing permit and no BCDC permit amendment would be needed. If it is planned to be located even partially within a BCDC required public access area and/or within the 100-foot-shoreline band, then an amendment would be needed.

The method to secure an amendment is to submit a letter describing the project including any impacts on existing public access, and plans showing what the letter describes. The application fees ([located here](#)) are based on the total project cost and, in this case, the fee would be nominal. If the fence would be located in a public access area, the fence would have to be located in a manner that would minimize adverse impacts and staff would have to consider the loss of public access and an offset would likely be required. Finally, only the property owner/permittee/s can make such an application.
