Enforcement Committee's Recommendation

Executive Summary. On February 21, 2019, the Enforcement Committee held a noticed public hearing to consider the Executive Director's Recommended Enforcement Decision regarding proposed Cease and Desist and Civil Penalty Order No. CDO2019.001.00,¹ and the evidence and arguments submitted by BCDC staff and Salt River Construction Corporation (SRCC). This report briefly summarizes the proceeding and the Enforcement Committee's decision to adopt the Executive Director's Recommended Enforcement Decision. At the conclusion of the meeting, the Committee recommended adoption of the proposed Order.

Enforcement Committee Recommendation. At the Enforcement Committee hearing, BCDC enforcement staff presented the facts of the case, as summarized in the Executive Director's Recommended Enforcement Decision, along with the recommended decision. SRCC representatives did not appear to present their position on the matter. One public speaker from San Francisco Baykeeper appeared and spoke in favor of the enforcement action, particularly in regard to the violation that was observed in Richardson's Bay.

The Committee unanimously voted to adopt the Executive Director's Recommended Enforcement Decision and proposed Cease and Desist and Civil Penalty Order.

The Executive Director's Recommended Enforcement Decision and the Enforcement Committee's proposed Cease and Desist and Civil Penalty Order are attached to this memo as Exhibits A and B, respectively. ¹ Staff recently revised the numbering system for enforcement orders to incorporate a nine-digit numbering system. The prior proposed order that was considered by the Enforcement Committee used the previous six-digit numbering system (i.e. CDO 2019.01), but the numbering on the recommended order has now been revised to use the new nine-digit numbering (i.e. CDO2019.001.00).
