



BEYOND THE ROCK

The inmates of US Penitentiary Alcatraz Island were entirely cut off from the outside world. Surrounded by San Francisco's world-famous attractions, they were limited to what they could see through barred windows and barbed-wire fences.

During the penitentiary's 29 years of operation (1934-1963), America underwent momentous change: the Great Depression, World War II, the rise of the Civil Rights movement, space travel. Alcatraz inmates, however, knew little about these changes—only what they could glean from censored magazines and tales told by newly arrived prisoners.








EXISTING SITE SECTION AND SLR PROJECTION ELEVATIONS
