Well, the Foster City Lagoon project keeps on keeping on. Apparently Salt River has left some equipment down in the Belmont Slough area near the Foster City intake channel and people are complaining. Also, the Coast Guard has been notified of a partially sunken barge. I think they still have a barge that has not be offloaded. As you recall, they were rejected at Cullinan Ranch. Rick Moseley hasn't been responding to inquiries from the Coast Guard.

Also, as you mentioned, a landowner in the area is concerned as are some other locals and a consultant working in the area.

Robert Perrera of Huffman-Broadway has been looking into the matter at my request. I'm sure there is more to come.

I'm informing our DMMO partners in case they get inquiries.

Alan Shu (Engineer at Foster City) was contacted by Sara from the Coast Guard regarding a half sunk barge and second barge with an excavator in Belmont Slough. She was calling the phone number she had for SaltRiver but no one was picking up or returning her call. She asked Alan if he had a different number and he gave her a cell phone number he had, but no one picks up calls from that line also.

Alan said he has not spoken to SaltRiver for over 3 weeks and according to discussions he had with Mr. Mosley he thought the barge used for the FC Intake project was setting at Cullinan Ranch ready to be offloaded, so he has no idea what they are doing or why they are in Belmont Slough.

The SaltRiver saga continues! These are your people Mark, I recommend Jim revoke your retirement until you clean up this mess.

We are getting inquiries about excavators, barges, and channel markers in Belmont Slough. I suspect Salt River has still not unloaded there barges from the intake channel dredging.

Do you know anything about this?

Jim - I was at a client's site in Foster City yesterday and there are several barges and two with large excavators parked just offshore of my client's property (one barge may be on his property as he has title to some of the bay). There are also several markers along the Belmont Slough channel. I skimmed through the PNs and didn't see any permit applications for dredging in this area. Is there active dredging planned for this area?

My client is curious as well as concerned that dredging may occur on his property without his permission. Also the barges and the markers along Belmont Slough are in a CDFW Ecological reserve.

Any information would be helpful.
