Subject: Sea Port Plan Alternative Analysis (March, 26, 2021)

Dear Committee Members,

On behalf of the 12 member ILWU unions in Northern California represented by the Northern California District Council of the ILWU, the council has concerns about the turning basin. Failure to retain the required acreage necessary to accommodate the new and future container vessels will jeopardize future cargo operations in the port of Oakland's inner harbor marine terminals.

The council is also concerned about the Oakland A's intent to remove acreage within the port of Oakland's sea-port planning area for bulk-cargo operations and the scrap metal export terminal. The stated intent by the city of Oakland through its draft downtown plan to remove acreage of industrial support property which supports the ports seaport planning area is also problematic.

The city of Oakland and the A's are intent on eliminating these specific maritime supporting areas which again marginalize long time support businesses that have made the port attractive to it's customers.

The BCDC should keep the A's honest and require that no permits will be issued until the A's have funded, implemented, and indemnified against all sea port impacts that are claimed to be guaranteed by the seaport compatibility measure.
