September 2023 Briefing

- Alameda had no anchor outs nor encampments at the time of the September 2023 briefing
- Alameda applied for \$200,000 in SAVE funds for 2024

- Oakland had approximately 20 vessels at the time of September 2023 briefing
- Oakland applied for \$170,000 in SAVE funds for 2024
- Oakland had comprehensive plan to address these vessels around December, 2023



Follow-Up from September 2023

- Cities of Oakland and Alameda committed to continuing to regularly coordinate with one another and BCDC staff to resolve remaining issues on Estuary
- Cities committed to keeping EC updated on progress
- Oakland committed to develop and implement a comprehensive plan to clear the Estuary of illegally anchored vessels
