PROJECT LOCATION








PROPOSED PROJECT

- Remove existing marina (108 slips; 100 twelve-inch creosote-treated wood piles)
- Construct new, expanded marina (168 slips 138 twenty-four and eighteen-inch steel piles)
- Provide a 705-linear-foot dock for transient moorage at a nominal fee
- Berth up to sixteen live-aboard boats at the marina to enhance security (10% of total slips)
- Dredging of Clipper Cove to be applied for separately later





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FILL IN THE BAY

- Net increase of 36,384 square feet of overwater fill and 225.6 cubic yards of solid fill
 - Remove existing 36,895-square-foot marina; 47.3 cubic yards of solid fill
 - Construct new 73,279-square-foot replacement marina; 273 cubic yards of solid fill
- No Shoreline Band component—marina connected to Clipper Cove Promenade with three gangways
- Water-oriented use



RECREATION AND MARINA POLICIES

• San Francisco Bay Plan Map No. 4, Policy 25 "Yerba Buena and Treasure Islands - Clipper Cove":

"Expand marina and other water-oriented recreation uses, provide water access for small watercraft, such as kayaks, and for swimming. Preserve beaches and eelgrass beds."

Recreation Policy 3.b:

"Marinas should be allowed at any suitable site on the Bay."

"...marinas should include public amenities, such as viewing areas, restrooms, public mooring docks or floats and moorages for transient recreational boaters, non-motorized small boat launching facilities, public parking; substantial physical and visual access; and maintenance for all facilities."



PUBLIC ACCESS

- Site constraints:
 - No landside project components
 - Limited Bay area leased by applicants
- Publicly accessible 705-foot transient boat dock, providing moorage at a nominal fee, for up to two consecutive nights
- Marina size reduced to one third of initial design, to limit impacts to existing recreational uses of Clipper Cove





NATURAL RESOURCE PROTECTIONS

- Pile installation and removal primarily with vibratory hammers
- In-water work limited to seasonal work window
- Pre-construction eelgrass survey and potential follow-up survey and monitoring
- Navy remediation site monitored to ensure two-foot layer of sediment maintained

2023.006.00 STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Recommend Approval with Conditions, including:

- Implement measures to protect natural resources and water quality during construction
- Conduct pre-construction eelgrass survey and potential followup survey and monitoring
- Reserve eastern side of Dock A for transient boating mooring, provided at a nominal fee, for up to two consecutive nights
