What is Being Reported Here:

The Executive Director acts on <u>administrative permit</u> applications. Pending administrative applications are reported here to inform Commissioners and the public and to answer any questions or concerns about the Executive Director's determination that a project is "minor" in scope.

The Commission has two options regarding how to proceed:

- If the Commission takes no action, the Executive Director will act on these pending applications within the deadlines established by state law; or,
- If a Commissioner objects to the classification of the project as "minor," and a majority of Commissioners agree, a hearing will be scheduled to decide on the proper classification of the project.

- **Location:** Within the Commission's Bay jurisdiction, at Marina Plaza Harbor, 2320 Marinship Way, Sausalito, Marin County.
- **Description:** Construct a sauna on an existing 675-square-foot barge and operate a commercial sauna company for five years. The heated portion of the sauna will be on the barge, and users will plunge into the Bay to complete the "Nordic cycle". The project will not increase bay fill, but will change the use and increase the use of the barge. The permittees will provide maximum feasible public access consistent with the project by providing free sauna passes to the community via library passes.

Location: Within the Primary Management Area of the Suisun Marsh at Van Sickle Island, in Solano County.
Description: Conduct emergency repairs to a levee that was breached on December 14, 2024. The repairs consist of the placement of approximately 1,500 cubic yards of fill and 600 cubic yards of riprap to repair the levee. The project was authorized using the emergency permitting process on January 22, 2025, and the work is expected to be completed February 28, 2025. The emergency permit authorizes the fill only until November 30, 2025, after which it must be removed unless the permittee applies for and receives a BCDC permit using the standard permit process.
