Purpose of This Report

The purpose of this report is to inform the Commission about new administrative matters.

Location: Within the Commission’s Bay jurisdiction, on the west span of the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge, in the City and County of San Francisco.

Description: A time extension has been issued to extend the authorized work period for the installation of the “Bay Lights 360” sculpture, a temporary installation consisting of approximately 48,000, 2-inch-diameter energy-efficient LED light bulbs on the inward- and outward-facing sides of the vertical suspension cables on the north-facing side of the upper deck of



the bridge, a project previously authorized under BCDC Permit No. M2012.009.04. Construction of the “Bay Lights 360” installation began in early November 2024, but paused due to circumstances outside of Caltrans’ control (manufacturing issues with the lights) that precluded Caltrans’ ability to diligently pursue completion of the authorized work within the original six-month timeline. This approval extends the window of time to install the structure, authorizing work to continue from January 20, 2026, to be diligently pursued to completion by January 20, 2027. This approval does not extend the duration for which the sculpture may operate or is authorized to remain in place, which period of authorization to December 31, 2033, remains unchanged from original project approval. There are no changes to the project’s design, location, or operational activities authorized as part of this time extension approval.
